## Nebraska Cornhuskers #1 in Preseason Poll

HAROGATE, TN---Defending national champion Nebraska tops the 2021-22 pre-season poll conducted by the National Ten Pin Coaches Association (NTCA). The Cornhuskers garnered 34 of the poll's 50 first-place votes to finish ahead of McKendree, Arkansas State, Vanderbilt and North Carolina A&T in the poll's top five.

Nebraska returns national Player of the Year Crystal Elliott along with All-Americans Kayla Verstraete and Cassidy Ray for Coach Paul Klempa, last year's national Coach of the Year.

McKendree, which pulled down seven first-place votes, also returns a trio of accomplished returnees. Senior Hope Gramly was a first-team NTCA All-America pick a year ago along with Division II/III Player of the Year honors. She is joined on the Bearcats roster by junior Maranda Pattison and sophomore Isabel Allen, both of whom earning All-America mention last season.

Arkansas State reached the national championship match a year ago and is third in the pre-season voting. The Red Wolves had one first place vote and are headlined by junior Faith Welch, a junior who was a 2021 first-team All-America. Veterans Sarah Sanes and Emma Stull also return.

Vanderbilt won the Southland Bowling League last year and has 100 percent of its production back this season. Junior Mabel Cummins, a second team All-American, and veteran Samantha Gainor head an otherwise young but experienced Commodore team.

North Carolina A&T has been tabbed as the pre-season favorite in the MEAC this year after its stellar campaign a year ago. A pair of third-team NTCA All-Americans, senior Erica Quesada and sophomore Melanie Katen, head the Aggies lineup.

Sam Houston State came in sixth in the polling, with Youngstown State seventh, Fairleigh Dickinson eighth and Louisiana Tech ninth, each with a first-place vote. Stephen F. Austin rounds out the Top 10.

Duquesne, Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's, Delaware State and Maryville (Ill.) head the second 10 with Tulane, Central Missouri, Lincoln Memorial, Monmouth, and Maryland Eastern Shore, which elected to sit out last year's Covid-19 season, complete the Top 20.

Wisconsin-Whitewater, Prairie View A & M, Long Island, Marian and Adelphi round out the Top 25.

Voting is done by NCAA head coaches that are members of the NTCA with 50 ballots cast.

NTCA voters rank the top 25 teams on their ballot. Each position has a designated point value, ranging from 40 points for first place and one point for twenty-fifth place. To be ranked teams need to equal or surpass the minimum vote criteria, which is one vote for every eight ballots submitted. The actual ranking position is determined by using the adjusted point standings, which lists in priority order the total points a school has accumulated after the highest and lowest votes are dropped.

The specific point values follow: 1st place = 40 points, 2nd = 37, 3rd = 35, 4th = 33, 5th = 31, 6th = 29, 7th = 27, 8th = 25, 9th = 23, 10th = 21, 11th = 19, 12th = 17, 13th = 15, 14th = 13, 15th = 11, 16th = 10, 17th = 9, 18th = 8, 19th = 7, 20th = 6, 21st = 5, 22nd = 4,

23rd = 3, 24th = 2, 25th = 1.
