## McKendree Bearcats #1 in NTCA Poll

NACOGDOCHES, TX---The McKendree Bearcats slid past Sam Houston State into the top spot of the January poll as the National Ten Pin Coaches Association continues to evaluate the top teams in NCAA bowling.

McKendree eased past Sam Houston, who held the No. 1 rank in the December poll, by a scant 32 poll points despite garnering two fewer first place votes (15 to 17) from the participating head coaches. A look at the January tournament results indicates why voters are undecided.

McKendree began the month with an impressive win at the Stormin' Blue and White in Las Vegas, then placed second at the 18-team Northeast Classic before ending the month with a fourth place finish at the Prairie View Invitational.

Sam Houston competed in just two tournaments, finishing fourth at the Northeast but coming back to win the Prairie View, an event that included the previously top eight ranked teams.

Nebraska remained in third place, gaining six first-place votes, with third place finishes at the Stormin' Blue and White and Prairie View while Vanderbilt slid up a notch into fourth on the strength of a win at the Northeast and a narrow loss to Sam Houston in the championship match at the Prairie View. The Commodores were also fourth in Las Vegas.

Louisiana Tech earned its first top five poll finish in program history, moving up from seventh after a fifth place showing at the Prairie View.

The poll's top 10 is completed by North Carolina A&T, slipping down from fourth into sixth place, followed by Arkansas State, Stephen F. Austin, Youngstown State and Mount St. Mary's. The poll points between the 8-9-10 teams were close.

Duquesne heads the second 10, followed by Fairleigh Dickinson, Maryville (St. Louis), Delaware State, Tulane, Maryland-Eastern Shore, Long Island University, Morgan State, Sacred Heart and Lewis. Lincoln-Memorial, Wisconsin-Whitewater, Adelphi, Monmouth and Kutztown complete the Top 25.

Voting is done by NCAA head coaches that are members of the NTCA with 39 ballots cast.

NTCA voters rank the top 25 teams on their ballot. Each position has a designated point value, ranging from 40 points for first place and one point for twenty-fifth place. To be ranked teams need to equal or surpass the minimum vote criteria, which is one vote for every eight ballots submitted. The actual ranking position is determined by using the adjusted point standings, which lists in priority order the total points a school has accumulated after the highest and lowest votes are dropped.
